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# Objective & Research Goals



Our objective for our client is to create an easy-to-navigate website, a social media presence, and a kickoff event to establish the Code For Athens brigade.



Our main research goals include:

- 1) Finding out how to launch a successful brigade
- 2) Crafting an agenda for initial brigade actions & priorities based on those findings

# Methodology

Our project will consist of **two main** pieces of user research.

- 1) Gaining information from people who have started a brigade through a **survey** & follow-up phone **interview**
- 2) Creating an agenda with that information on initial **actions and priorities** for the Athens brigade

## Action Plan

To obtain the most relevant information, the brigades we reach out to will be targeted towards those in college towns or cities with heavy student populations in general. We will also try to get a variation between brigades that began pre & post-COVID beginning.

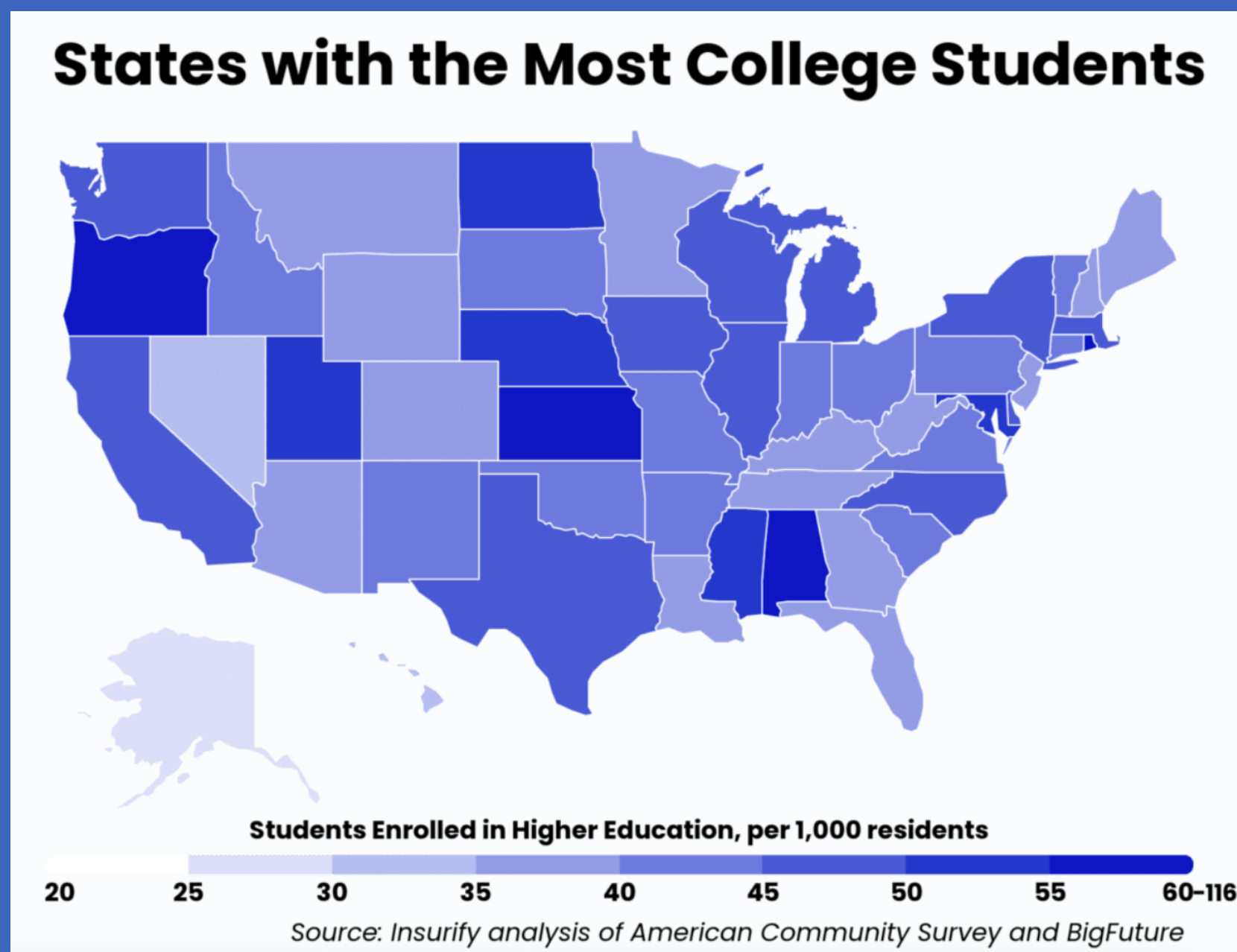
We will begin with sending them a general survey, which will conclude with the option for them to allow us to follow-up for a 10-15 minute interview.
